
PET DOG FAITHFUL TO DEATH.

Trained to Put Out Fires, He Dies
Proving His Worth—Master Fa-
tally Hurt at Same Time.

ROCHESTER, Nov. 28.—Harry Grant of Franklinville owned a mastiff which he spent weeks in teaching to put out fires with his paws. This morning, in illustrating to a friend the efficiency of his dog, Grant lighted a fuse attached to a dynamite cartridge. The dog rushed at the smoking fuse and endeavored to put it out, but failed.

Seeing the danger of his pet, Grant grabbed the animal by the tail and endeavored to pull him away. The explosion that followed tore the dog to pieces and fatally injured Grant.
